Mules prevail in lightning delayed opener, 29-9

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The Central Missouri Fighting Mules had to wait a little bit longer than they wanted to start the 2008 football season, thanks to a two-hour lightning delay at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field. The 9:04 kickoff didn't seem to matter though, as they scored on their first four possessions and tallied a 29-9 win over Minnesota State-Mankato, exacting revenge from last year's opener.

Junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** took the Mules 73 yards down the field on the game's first possession, hitting sophomore tight end **DeMarco Cosby** for a 28 yard chunk and junior wideout **Tim Richmond** for a 23 yard gain to get down to the one. On second down, he found senior Edgar Givens from two yards out for the score.

The Mules defense stopped the Mavericks on fourth down the next possession, a trend that would go on all game (MSU was 2-of-7 on fourth down conversions). UCM converted that into a 23-yard **Mark Starks** field goal after a 57-yard completion to Cosby set it up.

Czerniewski started the game 9-of-9 for 140 yards and carried that into the second quarter, tossing a nine-yard score to Warrensburg native **Zain Gower** out of the backfield to put the Mules up 17-0.

Senior defensive lineman **Neil Barnes** forced an MSU fumble a couple plays later that senior linebacker **Mike Dillon** recovered at the MSU 13. The Mules converted that into another field goal from Starks to make it 20 unanswered.

The Mavericks scored the final six points of the half, getting a field goal at the 4:44 mark and another with 29 second remaining in the period to make it 20-6 at the break.

Czerniewski was 13-of-19 for 230 yards and two scores in the half while MSU signal caller Ryan Fick was 9-of-17 for 145 yards.

Central Missouri's offense got a little sloppy in the second half, in part thanks to the rain. They fumbled three times (losing one) and had an interception. Minnesota State had five fumbles in the game, losing only the one in the first stanza.

The Mules had a chance to put the game out of reach when an errant snap went over MSU punter Gerard DeWet's head and back to the one yard line but the Mules couldn't get a handle on it and the ball went out of the end zone for a safety.

The closest Minnesota State would get from there is 22-9 on a Spencer Goff field goal with 27 seconds remaining in the third quarter. It got there with a 12-play, 45-yard drive that spanned 8:57, but that would be its last score of the night.

The Mules looked as if they would answer early with a blocked punt from Seth Mason, but senior running back **Glenn Milner** fumbled on a rough night the next play. He would finish with 49 yards on 20 carries as the Mules could only generate 73 rushing yards against the stout MSU defensive front.

Central Missouri did it in the air though, scoring the only points of the final period to put the game away. The Mules did it on fourth down and nine from the MSU 30. Czerniewski hit Givens again, and he battled his way in for his second score of the day with 3:55 left. The Mules drove 72 yards in eight plays to give Czerniewski his third TD pass of the game and get the fans home just after midnight.

The defense was the story though, holding MSU to only 213 yards passing and 17-of-41 completions to go with three sacks. The Mules also held the Maverick rushing attack to only 2.6 yards per carry. Senior linebacker **Adrian Singletary** led the way with 10 tackles and a forced fumble.

Czerniewski finished 21-of-32 for 319 yards while Givens had six grabs for 96 yards to go with his two scores. Cosby added 89 yards receiving for the Mules as well.

Wonder Boys Defense takes out NSU, 22-3

RUSSELLVILLE, Arkansas – Arkansas Tech opened its 94th season of intercollegiate football by posting a 22-3 win over Northeastern State in front of 6,303 fans in Thone Stadium at Buerkle Field.

The win marked the fifth consecutive year that the Wonder Boys opened the season with a victory, its longest such streak since winning five openers in a row from 1958-62.

Tech, who trailed 3-2 at the half thanks to a 43-yard field goal by NSU's Jared Homer, used an outstanding defense and an offense that gained 192 yards and scored three touchdowns in the second half to post its sixth straight win over the RiverHawks and even the all-time series at 19-19-2. For the game, Tech's offense gained 344 yards on 78 plays.

Entering Thursday's opener, Tech returned eight starters on offense, while the RiverHawks returned eight starters on defense, so the contest turned to Tech's defense that returned only four starters from a year ago.

Cole Barthel, one of Tech's eight returning starters on offense, finished the night 29-for-46 passing for 249 yards, but had three interceptions, one of which led to NSU's only points on Homer's field goal.

Tech opened the game's scoring in the second quarter on a safety as NSU quarterback Kaelin Woods was tackled in the end zone by sophomore defensive end Norman Bell. The safety came one play after

senior Nick McCaskill pinned his pouch punt at the RiverHawks 4-yard line.

In the third quarter, Tech finally scored its first offensive touchdown of the season on a 1-yard run by Barthel, but the two-point conversion play failed and Tech held an 8-3 lead. Barthel's score completed a 10-play, 71-yard drive by the Wonder Boys. The big play in the drive was a 31-yard pass from Barthel to junior receiver Landon Turner.

The Wonder Boys increased their lead to 15-3 just 90 seconds into the fourth quarter on a 6-yard run by redshirt freshman running back Joby Hills and the extra point by junior kicker Travis Cockerham. Hills' run completed a 13-play, 54-yard drive that took nearly seven minutes to complete.

On NSU's ensuing possession, the RiverHawks drove 48 yards in 10 plays and reached Tech's six-yard line, but failed to capitalize when quarterback Kenny Davis was sacked for an eight-yard loss by junior nose guard Matt Riser and Homer missed on a 30-yard field goal attempt.

Following that possession, Tech closed out the game's scoring as it drove 80 yards in 14 plays and scored its third touchdown of the half on a 3-yard pass play from Barthel to junior tight end Darryl Adams with 2:28 left in the game.

Senior receiver Tracey Stiger, who was one of the three Wonder Boys who were named Preseason All-Gulf South Conference selections, had a big night offensively as he caught nine of Barthel's 29 completions for 92 yards and two returns for 25 yards. On Tech's final scoring drive, Stiger caught a 19-yard pass from Barthel on a 4th-and-11 play.

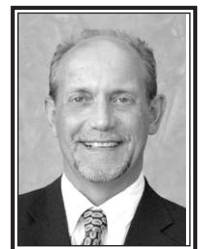
The Series & Coaches

The Mules and Wonder Boys have met only two times, splitting the series 1-1. The two outings came back in 1981 and 1982 as ATU grabbed the first by a 21-19 decision and UCM took the second contest 13-10. Both teams won on the road.

Willie Fritz is in his 12th season as head coach at the University of Central Missouri. He is 83-40 as the Mules' mentor, 61-37 vs. MIAA opponents. His .675 winning percentage is fourth best in UCM football history, while **his 83 career wins rank No. 1 in school history.**

A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, he currently ranks eighth in the MIAA in career wins, third among active MIAA coaches.

Steve Mullins is in his 12th season as the head football coach at Arkansas Tech and has compiled a 71-46 overall mark. He also serves as the athletic director there. He has earned two GSC Coach of the Year Awards (1999, 2004) and one South Region Coach of the Year in 2004 when he hosted and won a playoff game.

Scouting the Wonder Boys

Arkansas Tech comes in after a 22-3 win over Northeastern State (Okla.) in the opener last Thursday. They held the Riverhawks to only a field goal and 287 total yards of offense while putting up two fourth quarter TD's to ice the game.

On offense, they return starting quarterback Cole Barthel, who completed 68 percent of his passes last season and went 29-46 for 249 yards, three INT's and a touchdown last week. Leading receiver Tracey Stiger had nine grabs for 92 yards while the rushing attack was paced by a stable of four different backs (led by Tim Childress with 48 yards). The Wonder Boys had 344 yards of offense last week (244 pass, 95 rush).

The ATU defense allowed 31.7 points per game last season but put up an impressive performance in the opener against NSU. Safeties Tario Dansby and DeAuntra Rideau each had nine tackles and an interception to lead the Wonder Boys defense. They also boast a Preseason All-American punter in Michael Podobnik, who had only one punt for 54 yards last week.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 47-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus a 9-17 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents. However, the Mavericks out-rushed Central Missouri by a 111-to-73 margin but could only manage nine points (all three FG's).

Fritz Special Forces

Mules coach Willie Fritz is known for his attention to special teams. During his tenure, the Mules have **returned 20 punts for touchdowns and seven kickoffs to pay dirt**. And even more impressive, his teams have **blocked 32 punts** during his tenure (including one last week against MSU). The school record for blocks in a season is six (set twice, both in Fritz' reign, 2003 and 1999).

The Mules' **Seth Mason** got UCM's first punt block of the season against MSU, making it the second of his career (blocked one as a freshman in 2006 at Lincoln.).

Turnover Ratio

The Mules are 35-7 since 2001 when they have won the turnover battle compared to 12-11 when they have committed more turnovers. They are also 9-4 when both teams are tied in turnovers. Following is the break down for positive/negative

Given it Out

Senior wide receiver **Edgar Givens** had a breakout game in the opener against Minnesota State, setting career highs in catches (6), yards (94), and touchdowns (2). He scored the Mules first and last TD's in the game. His final tally iced the game and came on fourth down and nine as he ran in from 30 yards out and dove in over a couple defenders.

This Week in Mules Football

Against the Gulf South and Arkansas

Central Missouri is 0-2 against squads from the powerful Gulf South Conference with both losses coming to North Alabama in 1991 and 1992. Terry Noland's squad dropped a 28-7 match-up in Warrensburg and a controversial 17-16 decision in Florence.

The Mules have played against Central Arkansas 11 times (last meeting was in 1988) and Henderson State two times (1985 and 1986), but neither of those two schools joined the GSC until 1993 (UCA left for Division I in 2007).

UCM is 6-13 against teams from Arkansas since 1966 and 8-15 overall. Last time they played a team from the state came against Central Arkansas in 1988 (Mules lost 35-14 in Warrensburg). The last time they beat a team from there was Henderson State by a 21-14 decision in 1986.

Baseball Draft Picks

Arkansas Tech quarterback Cole Barthel played minor league baseball for four years before coming back to play football. He was drafted in the second round with pick No. 72 in 2001. UCM also had a draft pick in the second round in 6-7 flamethrower **Nick Webber** (pick No. 78 in 2005 to the Cardinals).

Thursday Night Lights

This will be the Mules second game under the lights at home in as many weeks. The Mules have not played home back-to-back Thursday night games since 2005 when they played against Adams State and Lincoln, winning both outings.

The Mules game against MSU was delayed two hours due to lightning. It was the first since playing at Northwest Missouri State a year ago, when it was delayed an hour prior to kickoff.

Outside the Conference

UCM has been nearly unbeatable in non-conference regular season games under head coach Willie Fritz. They are 21-2 overall and have won 21 of their last 22. UCM has won every non-conference game it has played at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field under Fritz, going 16-0.

Touchdown Stingy

The Mules didn't allow a single touchdown last week against Minnesota State as it hit only three field goals in the game. The 2007 team allowed at least a TD in every game and the last time UCM held an opponent without one was back in 2006 in a shutout of Dakota State, 52-0.

Mules in the Pros:

There are two Mules on NFL rosters coming into the 2008 season and both are playing for the San Francisco 49ers. Tight end/H-back **Delanie Walker (2004-05)** just signed a three-year, \$6 million contract with a \$1.8 million signing bonus. The other is **Roderick Green (2002-03)**, who appeared in seven games last season as a defensive end/linebacker.

UCM also has three players excelling in the AFL. **Colston Weatherington (1999-2000)** plays for the Dallas Desperados and was AFL Lineman of the Year, **Kevin Nickerson (1998-2001)** plays for the Orlando Predators, and **Todd Devoe (2001-02)** is with the Arizona Rattlers.

Mules 29, Minnesota State 9

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The Central Missouri Fighting Mules had to wait a little bit longer than they wanted to start the 2008 football season, thanks to a two-hour lightning delay at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field. The 9:04 kickoff didn't seem to matter though, as they scored on their first four possessions and tallied a 29-9 win over Minnesota State-Mankato, exacting revenge from last year's opener.

Junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** took the Mules 73 yards down the field on the game's first possession, hitting sophomore tight end **DeMarco Cosby** for a 28 yard chunk and junior wideout **Tim Richmond** for a 23 yard gain to get down to the one. On second down, he found senior Edgar Givens from two yards out for the score.

The Mules defense stopped the Mavericks on fourth down the next possession, a trend that would go on all game (MSU was 2-of-7 on fourth down conversions). UCM converted that into a 23-yard **Mark Starks** field goal after a 57-yard completion to Cosby set it up.

Czerniewski started the game 9-of-9 for 140 yards and carried that into the second quarter, tossing a nine-yard score to Warrensburg native **Zain Gower** out of the backfield to put the Mules up 17-0.

Senior defensive lineman **Neil Barnes** forced an MSU fumble a couple plays later that senior linebacker **Mike Dillon** recovered at the MSU 13. The Mules converted that into another field goal from Starks to make it 20 unanswered.

The Mavericks scored the final six points of the half, getting a field goal at the 4:44 mark and another with 29 second remaining in the period to make it 20-6 at the break.

Czerniewski was 13-of-19 for 230 yards and two scores in the half while MSU signal caller Ryan Fick was 9-of-17 for 145 yards.

Central Missouri's offense got a little sloppy in the second half, in part thanks to the rain. They fumbled three times (losing

one) and had an interception. Minnesota State had five fumbles in the game, losing only the one in the first stanza.

The Mules had a chance to put the game out of reach when an errant snap went over MSU punter Gerard DeWet's head and back to the one yard line but the Mules couldn't get a handle on it and the ball went out of the end zone for a safety.

The closest Minnesota State would get from there is 22-9 on a Spencer Goff field goal with 27 seconds remaining in the third quarter. It got there with a 12-play, 45-yard drive that spanned 8:57, but that would be its last score of the night.

The Mules looked as if they would answer early with a blocked punt from Seth Mason, but senior running back **Glenn Milner** fumbled on a rough night the next play. He would finish with 49 yards on 20 carries as the Mules could only generate 73 rushing yards against the stout MSU defensive front.

Central Missouri did it in the air though, scoring the only points of the final period to put the game away. The Mules did it on fourth down and nine from the MSU 30. Czerniewski hit Givens again, and he battled his way in for his second score of the day with 3:55 left. The Mules drove 72 yards in eight plays to give Czerniewski his third TD pass of the game and get the fans home just after midnight.

The defense was the story though, holding MSU to only 213 yards passing and 17-of-41 completions to go with three sacks. The Mules also held the Maverick rushing attack to only 2.6 yards per carry. Senior linebacker **Adrian Singletary** led the way with 10 tackles and a forced fumble.

Czerniewski finished 21-of-32 for 319 yards while Givens had six grabs for 96 yards to go with his two scores. Cosby added 89 yards receiving for the Mules as well.
