Mules 2007 In Review

The Central Missouri Mules of 2007 were one win away from making the NCAA Playoffs and showed they had the potential with a 28-14 win over a playoff team in Washburn on the road, and a narrow two point loss to eventual national runner-up Northwest Missouri State in Maryville.

The Mules defeated Concordia St. Paul 56-24 on the strength of a near school record 18 points from kicker Marcelo Velazquez in the home opener. They defeated Truman State 27-7 the next week, and the win over Washburn had UCM thinking it would be in the hunt after an impressive defensive display, holding the Ichabods without a first down until the second half. The Mules took a 3-1 record into a matchup with Pittsburg State but a fourth down goal-line dive for a touchdown by the Gorillas forced a second OT and they grabbed the 38-31 win.

UCM rebounded with a road trouncing of Emporia State by a 38-7 margin. After a failed two-point conversion on a dramatic comeback attempt against Northwest Missouri, the Mules made it a great homecoming with a 24-23 win over Missouri Southern, thanks to a blocked extra point from senior Dallas Bryant.

They sent SBU out of the league with a 56-14 setback the next week and also took out Fort Hays State in the season finale on senior day by a 31-10 margin. Their final chance to make a playoff bid came against Missouri Western on the road in November, but mistakes cost them in dropping a 42-28 decision. The Mules finished 6-3 in MIAA play, tying for third place.

Individually, All-American free safety **Kendall Ricketts** had another great season, setting the school record for tackles with 344 and earning All-American honors for the third consecutive year. Junior running back **Glenn Milner** paced the offense, running for 1,046 yards and 18 touchdowns to rank in the single season charts in both categories.

13 Mules received postseason recognition for their efforts on the field. Ricketts, along with junior linebacker **Adrian Singletary** and junior defensive end

John Wood were named to the All-MIAA first team. Wood paced the squad in sacks with 8.5 while Singletary ranked tops on the team with 84 tackles.

Second team all-league honors went to Milner and junior offensive tackle **Craig Harrison** on offense, while sophomore cornerback **Randy Shepherd** and senior punter **Matt Frankel** grabbed those accolades for the defense. Honorable mention honors went to junior offensive lineman **Mike Gunselman**, senior **Jon Books**, senior kick returner **Anthony Parks**, junior defensive lineman **Derek Lampkin**, senior defensive back **Justin Brown**, and junior defensive back **Steven Ehasz**.

After the season Ricketts and Frankel were honored by earning invitations from the Cactus Bowl to play in the Division II All-Star Game in Kingsville, Texas.

The Mules also did the job in the classroom. 21 student-athletes were named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.

Last Time They Met - August 23, 2007

(Mankato, Minn.) – The University of Central Missouri Mules failed to take advantage of five turnovers by host Minnesota State-Mankato in the 2007 season opener as they let a second half lead slip through their fingers to fall 23-14.

Central Missouri had a few questions coming into the game as sophomore Eric Czerniewski made his first ever start behind an injury-riddled offensive line. They also had the field conditions to deal with as it had rained every day for the past week at Blakeslee Stadium. The mud made it difficult for the Mules to run the ball, taking away the ability to cut up-field. It became a passing competition, and the experience of MSU quarterback Ben King and the speed of new wide receiver Donte Shackelford showed through.

The game opened up well for the Mules though. After the Mavericks moved it down to the Mules 10 yard line on a 58 yard bomb to Shackelford, UCM senior cornerback Bruce Williams picked off a King pass at the two and took it out to the 17. The Mules went three and out for the second time in as many tries though. John Samia picked off King on the next possession and took it into MSU territory. The Mules would get it into range, but kicker Marcelo Velazquez pushed it right from 35 yards.

It would be the second quarter before the Mules offense could get things going. Czerniewski led the Mules down field for a 62-yard scoring drive, completing passes to running back Glenn Milner, and the brother tandem of wide receivers, Adam and Anthony Parks. He would cap the drive with a four-yard toss to younger brother Adam for the score.

The Mavericks would answer with 4:52 to go in the half on another long pass to Shackelford, this time from 40 yards out. The drive was set up by an interception from Czerniewski by MSU's Mike Hinton (first of two on the day). The teams would go into the break with the score tied at seven as UCM failed to turn any of its three interceptions into points.

The Mules looked as if they would change their fortunes early in the third quarter when Samia made his second pick of the game and returned it to the MSU 23 yard line. They turned that into a 14-7 lead as Czerniewski connected with Anthony Parks from 17 yards out on third down.

The Mules tried to extend that advantage on their next drive but it stalled on the MSU 29 yard line and they were forced to punt. The Maverick offense came alive on its next possession as they ran the ball four consecutive times before tossing another long pass over the top from 55 yards out to tie the game at 14. It was a nine-play, 95 yard drive that took only three minutes off the clock.

UCM looked as if it would answer on the next possession but a Czerniewski fumble at the MSU 29 gave the ball back to the Mavericks. Minnesota State gave it right back on the next series after moving it all the way to the Mules two yard line on another bomb. It tried a double reverse that was fumbled and then recovered by sophomore defensive end Layne Kreter.

The Mules would gain only one first down on the next three possessions though, leaving the door open for MSU. With 5:30 remaining in the game, the Mavs made their move. Shackelford had catches of 19 and 26 yards before the Mules sacked King and forced MSU into a third and 23 situation at the Mules

40. King completed an 18 yard pass though, and Jason Tompkins drilled a 39 yard field goal to give the Mavericks a 17-14 lead with only 2:26 remaining.

The Mules failed to convert on fourth down on the next series and gave the ball back to MSU with 1:56 on the clock. King hooked up with Shackelford from 15 yards out to put the icing on the cake.

The Series & Coaches

The Mules and Minnesota State met for the first time ever last season in Mankato with the Mavericks taking a 23-14 win. Additionally, the Mules are 5-0 against teams from the NSIC, a conference MSU joined this season.

Willie Fritz is in his 12th season as head coach at the University of Central Missouri. He is 82-40 as the Mules' mentor, 61-37 vs. MIAA opponents. His .672 winning percentage is fourth best in UCM football history, while **his 82 career wins ranks No. 1 in school history.**

A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, he currently ranks eighth in the MIAA in career wins, third among active MIAA coaches.

Todd Hoffner is in his first season at Minnesota State after serving as the offensive coordinator at South Dakota the past two seasons. Prior to his time there, he was the head coach at Division III Wisconsin- Eau Claire. He is the 14th coach in MSU football history.

Scouting the Mavericks

Minnesota State comes into the 2008 season with a new look with head coach Todd Hoffner at the helm. Last year the Mavericks ran a spread offense, passing nearly every time, but Hoffner had a predominately running offense at South Dakota, attempting nearly 500 rushes, compared to only 293 passes.

Individually, the offense returns seven starters, headlined by senior running back Donte Shackelford, who played wide receiver last season. He had six grabs for 161 yards and two touchdowns against the Mules. Backup quarterback Ryan Fick will be the starter after playing in four games last year and throwing for 38 yards and a touchdown.

The Mavericks defense returns its top five tacklers and its leading sack man as well. Senior linebacker Blake Freese leads the way with 82 stops, including 10 for loss while junior defensive end Randy Earl had 66 tackles and 10 sacks. The defense allowed 24.5 points per game in 2007 including only 13 touchdown passes.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 47-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus an 8-17 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents. Last season the Mules outrushed eight of their 11 opponents, going 6-2 in those contests.

Fritz Special Forces

Mules coach Willie Fritz is known for his attention to special teams. During his tenure, the Mules have **returned 20 punts for touchdowns and seven kickoffs to pay dirt.** And even more impressive, his teams have **blocked 31 punts** during his tenure. The school record for blocks in a season is six (set twice, both in Fritz' reign, 2003 and 1999).

For Openers

The Mules are 9-2 in season openers in the Willie Fritz era and had won the lidlifter nine years in a row until last season's loss to the Mavericks. The only other loss on opening day was in 1997 to Nebraska-Omaha on the road by a 41-12 margin. Central Missouri is 1-1 against NSIC teams in openers as well, the other being a 45-26 win against Winona State in 2000.

The Mules have opened the season at home five times, going 5-0. The last time they hosted a home opener was in 2005. They have also outscored every opponent by at least two touchdowns in those games.

Against the Land of 10,000 Lakes

Central Missouri has played teams from Minnesota five times, going 4-1. The last meeting before Minnesota State in 2007 was against Minnesota-Duluth in the Mineral Water Bowl in 2001 when the Mules took a 48-17 win. UCM has also defeated Winona State two times, and St. Cloud State once. All of the Mules wins in the series were during Willie Fritz' tenure.

Thursday Night Lights

This will be the Mules first game under the lights at home since dismantling Dakota State in 2006 by a 52-0 margin. The Mules have not played a home Thursday night game since 2005 when they played back-to-back against Adams State and Lincoln, winning both outings.

Last season they played the Mavericks on the road under the lights on a Thursday night.

Outside the Conference

UCM has been nearly unbeatable in non-conference regular season games under head coach Willie Fritz. They are 20-2 overall and have won 20 of their last 21. Last year the Mules went 1-1, falling to Minnesota State and defeating Concordia-St. Paul 56-24.

Mules in the Pros:

There are two Mules on NFL rosters coming into the 2008 season and both are playing for the San Francisco 49ers. Tight end/H-back **Delanie Walker (2004-05)** just signed a three-year, \$6 million contract with a \$1.8 million signing bonus. The other is **Roderick Green (2002-03)**, who appeared in seven games last season as a defensive end/linebacker.

UCM also has three players excelling in the AFL. **Colston Weatherington (1999-2000)** plays for the Dallas Desperados and was AFL Lineman of the Year, **Kevin Nickerson (1998-2001)** plays for the Orlando Predators, and **Todd Devoe (2001-02)** is with the Arizona Rattlers.

Mules 14, Minnesota State 23

(Mankato, Minn.) – The University of Central Missouri Mules failed to take advantage of five turnovers by host Minnesota State-Mankato in the 2007 season opener as they let a second half lead slip through their fingers to fall 23-14.

Central Missouri had a few questions coming into the game as sophomore Eric Czerniewski made his first ever start behind an injury-riddled offensive line. They also had the field conditions to deal with as it had rained every day for the past week at Blakeslee Stadium. The mud made it difficult for the Mules to run the ball, taking away the ability to cut up-field. It became a passing competition, and the experience of MSU quarterback Ben King and the speed of new wide receiver Donte Shackelford showed through.

The game opened up well for the Mules though. After the Mavericks moved it down to the Mules 10 yard line on a 58 yard bomb to Shackelford, UCM senior cornerback Bruce Williams picked off a King pass at the two and took it out to the 17. The Mules went three and out for the second time in as many tries though. John Samia picked off King on the next possession and took it into MSU territory. The Mules would get it into range, but kicker Marcelo Velazquez pushed it right from 35 yards.

It would be the second quarter before the Mules offense could get things going. Czerniewski led the Mules down field for a 62-yard scoring drive, completing passes to running back Glenn Milner, and the brother tandem of wide receivers, Adam and Anthony Parks. He would cap the drive with a four-yard toss to younger brother Adam for the score.

The Mavericks would answer with 4:52 to go in the half on another long pass to Shackelford, this time from 40 yards out. The drive was set up by an interception from Czerniewski by MSU's Mike Hinton (first of two on the day). The teams would go into the break with the score tied at seven as UCM

failed to turn any of its three interceptions into points.

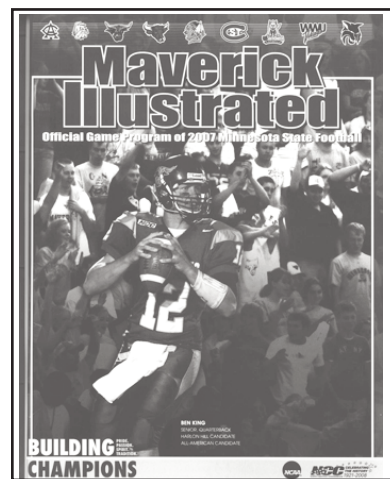
The Mules looked as if they would change their fortunes early in the third quarter when Samia made his second pick of the game and returned it to the MSU 23 yard line. They turned that into a 14-7 lead as Czerniewski connected with Anthony Parks from 17 yards out on third down.

The Mules looked as if they would extend that advantage on their next drive but it stalled on the MSU 29 yard line and they were forced to punt. The Maverick offense came alive on its next possession as they ran the ball four consecutive times before tossing another long pass over the top from 55 yards out to tie the game at 14. It was a nine-play, 95 yard drive that took only three minutes off the clock.

UCM looked as if it would answer on the next possession but a Czerniewski fumble at the MSU 29 gave the ball back to the Mavericks. Minnesota State gave it right back on the next series after moving it all the way to the Mules two yard line on another bomb. It tried a double reverse that was fumbled and then recovered by sophomore defensive end Layne Kreter.

The Mules would gain only one first down on the next three possessions though, leaving the door open for MSU. With 5:30 remaining in the game, the Mavs made their move. Shackelford had catches of 19 and 26 yards before the Mules sacked King and forced MSU into a third and 23 situation at the Mules 40. King completed an 18 yard pass though, and Jason Tompkins drilled a 39 yard field goal to give the Mavericks a 17-14 lead with only 2:26 remaining.

The Mules failed to convert on fourth down on the next series and gave the ball back to MSU with 1:56 on the clock. King hooked up with Shackelford from 15 yards out to put the icing on the cake.
