Mules hold off Bulldogs, 31-28

(Kirksville, Mo.) – The No. 24 Central Missouri Mules football squad jumped out early and held on late for a 31-28 MIAA road win over Truman State on Saturday night. Senior running back **Glenn Milner** rushed for 128 yards and scored twice as the Mules moved to 3-0 for the first time since 2003.

The game was the first at home for Truman this season and the first ever under new lights and synthetic turf. It was a good thing too, as it rained steadily during the entire game. Central Missouri used another balanced effort on offense and out-rushed the Bulldogs 135-3 to gain the edge in time of possession by nearly five minutes.

The Mules took their first drive down the field for a touchdown, (making it three consecutive games that they have done it) going 60 yards in 10 plays. Milner plunged in from a yard out for the score.

Truman came right back though, tying it with a 36 yard pass from quarterback Matt Ticich, who had a huge day throwing the ball. He finished with 379 yards and two TD's on the day while throwing the ball 48 times.

The Mules drove down to the Truman State 29 early in the second quarter before getting stuck with a fourth and four. Junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** was up to the task though, and he hit Milner up the seam for his second score of the day.

Central Missouri got inside the Truman 10 yard line midway through the quarter, but had to settle for a **Mark Starks** field goal to make it 17-7. The Mules had another missed opportunity on their next drive, getting the ball on the TSU 24 yard line after the Bulldogs had a bad snap over the punter's head. Three penalties by UCM forced it into a fourth and 31 and an ensuing punt.

Central Missouri looked as if it would make a rout of it in the second half

after taking its first drive down the field for a score to make it 24-7. The 11-play, 67-yard drive was capped by a 12-yard strike from Czerniewski to fullback **Brent Boehringer** (first career TD).

UCM looked to pin TSU back deep after stalling at the 50 on the next possession but the Bulldogs blocked the Mule punt and Anton Bernard returned it for a touchdown. Truman continued the momentum swing in the fourth quarter by putting together a 14-play, 90-yard drive that took 7:02 off the clock. Ticich struck from seven yards out for his second TD pass of the day, cutting it to 24-21.

Central Missouri stalled again at the Truman 40 on the next drive but a pooch punt by Czerniewski pinned the Bulldogs on their own five yard line. The Mules defense made the game's next big play when junior cornerback **LaVance Dotson** picked off a Ticich pass and returned it 30 yards for a score to make it 31-21 with five minutes to play.

Truman came right back though, and used some trickery to convert a fourth and nine from the UCM 27. Phillip Henry took a lateral pass from Ticich and tossed a 26 yard pass to Phil Kenney for the conversion. Kenney then ran it in from a yard out for the score to cut the margin to three with 2:53 left.

Central Missouri knew all it had to do was get one first down to ice the game on the next possession though. Milner ran the first play two yards before junior utility man **Bobby Guillory** ran for seven more to get within one yard. Milner finished it off on third down though, getting the first down on his second effort.

The Mules had nearly 300 yards of offense in the game (162 passing and 135 rushing) while Czerniewski was 17-of-29 and perhaps more importantly, no interceptions. His main target was tight end **DeMarco Cosby** with five grabs for 62 yards. Guillory was big on special teams as he gave the Mules good field position all day, returning four kickoffs for 103 yards.

Defensively, the Mules were led by linebacker **Mike Dillon** with nine tackles while linebacker **Max Fairclough** and strong safety **Steven Ehasz** had eight and seven stops, respectively.

Tigers upset No. 18 Ichabods, 17-7

HAYS, Kan. -- Junior RB Jacobb Irvin rushed for 154 yards on 24 carries, including an 88-yard touchdown run to give Fort Hays State the first-quarter lead, as the Tigers went on to claim a 17-7 upset over No. 18 Washburn Saturday night (Sept. 13) at Lewis Field Stadium.

The Tigers (2-1, 1-0 MIAA) snapped a three-game losing skid in the series with the Ichabods (2-1, 0-1 MIAA).

A fumbled punt return late in the second quarter by WU gave Fort Hays State the ball on the Ichabods' 11-yard line, and three plays later, junior QB Mike Garrison found junior RB Anthony Dickson for a 7-yard touchdown toss with 1:58 left in the half to make it 14-0.

Junior LB Zach Watkins set up the only Washburn touchdown with his interception of Garrison which gave the Ichabods possession at the FHSU 9. Senior RB Brandon Walker cashed in from 2 yards to cut the gap to 14-7 with 6:01 left in the third quarter. Walker ended up with 60 yards of 17 carries for WU.

The Tigers defense forced Washburn to punt on their next two possessions before senior DB Allen Walker picked off a pass by sophomore QB Jake Iverson and returned it 48 yards to the Ichabods' 34-yard line. The WU defense held FHSU on three plays, forcing a 48-yard field goal try by junior K Nathan Rausa.

The transfer from Northern Iowa drilled the kick and gave the Tigers a 10-point cushion. The Fort Hays State defense forced two more three-and-outs to preserve the win.

Irvin accounted for all but 36 yards of the FHSU offense, as Washburn out-gained the Tigers, 287-190.

Iverson was 16-of-42 passing for 202 yards. Junior WR Joe Hastings had six catches for 76 yards to lead the Ichabods. Sophomore WR Anthony Smith caught four of Garrison's six completions for 37 yards.

Senior LB Bruce Ringwood and sophomore LB Ray Trice each had 10 tackles for Washburn -- Trice had two sacks and one other tackle for loss to his credit. Sophomore DB Seth Blackwell and senior LB Andrew Jones each had nine stops for FHSU.

The Series & Coaches

This is the 40th meeting between the Mules and the Ichabods with Central Missouri holding a 20-17-2 advantage. The Mules went to Topeka and won a 28-14 decision last year, breaking a two game skid to the Ichabods. Central Missouri has won nine of the last 11 games in the series though, winning eight in a row from 1997-2004.

During the Willie Fritz era, the Mules are 9-2 against Washburn and are 4-1 in Warrensburg. Fritz is 4-2 against Schurig.

Willie Fritz is in his 12th season as head coach at the University of Central Missouri. He is 85-40 as the Mules' mentor, 62-37 vs. MIAA opponents. His .680 winning percentage is third best in UCM football history, while **his 84 career wins rank No. 1 in school history.**

A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, he currently ranks eighth in the MIAA in career wins, third among active MIAA coaches.

Craig Schurig is in his seventh season at Washburn and boasts a 42-30 overall record. He led the Ichabods to the MIAA title in 2005 and to an 8-4 record and NCAA-II Playoff appearance last year.

Scouting the Ichabods

The No. 25 Ichabods come in after suffering an upset last week on the road at Fort Hays State by a 17-7 margin. The surprising thing is that loss came just one week after Washburn defeated FCS member Missouri State in Springfield by a 35-27 score.

They are led on offense by running back Brandon Walker, who averages 81.3 yards per game, and first-year quarterback Jake Iverson, who throws for 227.3 yards per outing. Joe Hastings and Brad Cole lead the squad in catches. Iverson completes only 41 percent of his passes though, and the offense averages 23 points a game.

The defense is one of the most stingy in Division II. Linebackers Zach Watkins, Michael Wilhoite, Bruce Ringwood, and Michael Krajccek are among the team leaders in tackles while holding opponents to only 15.7 points and 282 yards per game.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 49-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus a 9-17 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents. UCM out-rushed Truman 135-3. The Bulldogs were limited to only three total yards on 23 attempts.

Fritz Special Forces

Mules coach Willie Fritz is known for his attention to special teams. During his tenure, the Mules have **returned 20 punts for touchdowns** and **eight kickoffs to pay dirt**. And even more impressive, his teams have **blocked 32 punts** during his tenure (including one against MSU). The school record for blocks in a season is six (set twice, both in Fritz' reign, 2003 and 1999).

In this season alone, the Mules' **Seth Mason** got a punt block against MSU, making it the second of his career (blocked one as a freshman in 2006 at Lincoln.). They also blocked a field goal (**Tyler Nay**) and an extra point (**Shawn Cox**) against Arkansas Tech.

Turnover Ratio

The Mules are 37-7 since 2001 when they have won the turnover battle compared to 12-11 when they have committed more turnovers. They are also 9-4 when both teams are tied in turnovers. Following is the breakdown for positive/negative

Given it Out

Senior wide receiver **Edgar Givens** had a breakout game in the opener against Minnesota State, setting career highs in catches (6), yards (94), and touchdowns (2). He scored the Mules first and last TD's in the game. He followed that with a three catch, 89-yard performance and another touchdown against Arkansas Tech.

In MIAA Home Openers

The Mules are 7-4 in MIAA home openers in the Willie Fritz era, winning against Truman last season 27-7. The Mules have won two of their last three and five of their last seven home MIAA openers at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

Milner's the Man

Glenn Milner has scored seven touchdowns (four rushing, three receiving) this season to lead the Mules offense. He has also compiled two consecutive 100-yard rushing games, giving him eight for his career. He also moved up several career charts, including career touchdowns (26) and rushing touchdowns (22). He is the highest scoring two-year player in school history, passing Todd Devoe last week, and he still has at least eight more games this year (on page 7).

Milner scored his 22nd career rushing score to move into sixth all-time. He needs only two more to tie Dane Henningsen (1974-77) on the list.

This Week in Mules Football

In the MIAA

The Mules are 62-37 in MIAA play during the Willie Fritz era after going 6-3 a year ago. Their best MIAA record came in 2002 when they posted an 8-1 mark, losing only to Northwest Missouri by a 10-7 margin.

Undefeated Starts

Central Missouri has started 3-0 on six occasions now under head coach Willie Fritz, out of 12 seasons. The Mules have started 4-0 four times, but have not done it since 2003 when they defeated Missouri Southern 50-7.

Their best start came in 2002 when they came out of the gates at 8-0.

In the Polls

The Mules are nationally ranked in the AFCA poll at No. 20 this week. It is their highest ranking since September 8, 2006 when they came in ranked No. 19.

UCM is also ranked No. 19 in the D2Football.com media poll this week.

Versus Ranked Opposition

The Mules are 0-6 against ranked opponents in the last three seasons (2006-08) but ended the 2005 season with a bang when they defeated the 11th ranked Pittsburg State Gorillas 83-21 at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

The Mules had not knocked off a ranked opponent since 2003 before that. They defeated No. 10 Emporia State and No. 17 Northwest Missouri that year on the way to a share of the MIAA title.

Schedule Strength

Central Missouri has a tough patch of schedule coming ahead as three of their next four opponents are nationally ranked. They start this week with No. 25 Washburn, then head to No. 7 Pittsburg State, followed two weeks after that with No. 9 Northwest Missouri at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

Super Czerniewski

Mules junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski has been a new man this season, completing 64 percent of his passes (55 percent in 2007) and tossing eight TD's compared to only one INT (14-to-10 in 2007). He also ranks second in the MIAA in efficiency at 158.94.

Czerniewski has also climbed the Central Missouri career passing charts in several categories (complete lists on page 7). He moved to seventh in career TD passes at 23 while ranking ninth in completions and ninth in attempts in a career. He is 43 yards away from cracking the top 10 in that category as well.

Mules in the Pros:

There are two Mules on NFL rosters coming into the 2008 season and both are playing for the San Francisco 49ers. UCM also has three players excelling in the AFL. **Colston Weatherington (1999-2000)** plays for the Dallas Desperados and was AFL Lineman of the Year, **Kevin Nickerson (1998-2001)** plays for the Orlando Predators, and **Todd Devoe (2001-02)** is with the Arizona Rattlers.

Mules 29, Minnesota State 9

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The Central Missouri Fighting Mules had to wait a little bit longer than they wanted to start the 2008 football season, thanks to a two-hour lightning delay at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field. The 9:04 kickoff didn't seem to matter though, as they scored on their first four possessions and tallied a 29-9 win over Minnesota State-Mankato, exacting revenge from last year's opener.

Junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** took the Mules 73 yards down the field on the game's first possession, hitting sophomore tight end **DeMarco Cosby** for a 28 yard chunk and junior wideout **Tim Richmond** for a 23 yard gain to get down to the one. On second down, he found senior Edgar Givens from two yards out for the score.

The Mules defense stopped the Mavericks on fourth down the next possession, a trend that would go on all game (MSU was 2-of-7 on fourth down conversions). UCM converted that into a 23-yard **Mark Starks** field goal after a 57-yard completion to Cosby set it up.

Czerniewski started the game 9-of-9 for 140 yards and carried that into the second quarter, tossing a nine-yard score to Warrensburg native **Zain Gower** out of the backfield to put the Mules up 17-0.

Senior defensive lineman **Neil Barnes** forced an MSU fumble a couple plays later that senior linebacker **Mike Dillon** recovered at the MSU 13. The Mules converted that into another field goal from Starks to make it 20 unanswered.

The Mavericks scored the final six points of the half, getting a field goal at the 4:44 mark and another with 29 second remaining in the period to make it 20-6 at the break.

Czerniewski was 13-of-19 for 230 yards and two scores in the half while MSU signal caller Ryan Fick was 9-of-17 for 145 yards.

Central Missouri's offense got a little sloppy in the second half, in part thanks to the rain. They fumbled three times (losing

one) and had an interception. Minnesota State had five fumbles in the game, losing only the one in the first stanza.

The Mules had a chance to put the game out of reach when an errant snap went over MSU punter Gerard DeWet's head and back to the one yard line but the Mules couldn't get a handle on it and the ball went out of the end zone for a safety.

The closest Minnesota State would get from there is 22-9 on a Spencer Goff field goal with 27 seconds remaining in the third quarter. It got there with a 12-play, 45-yard drive that spanned 8:57, but that would be its last score of the night.

The Mules looked as if they would answer early with a blocked punt from Seth Mason, but senior running back **Glenn Milner** fumbled on a rough night the next play. He would finish with 49 yards on 20 carries as the Mules could only generate 73 rushing yards against the stout MSU defensive front.

Central Missouri did it in the air though, scoring the only points of the final period to put the game away. The Mules did it on fourth down and nine from the MSU 30. Czerniewski hit Givens again, and he battled his way in for his second score of the day with 3:55 left. The Mules drove 72 yards in eight plays to give Czerniewski his third TD pass of the game and get the fans home just after midnight.

The defense was the story though, holding MSU to only 213 yards passing and 17-of-41 completions to go with three sacks. The Mules also held the Maverick rushing attack to only 2.6 yards per carry. Senior linebacker **Adrian Singletary** led the way with 10 tackles and a forced fumble.

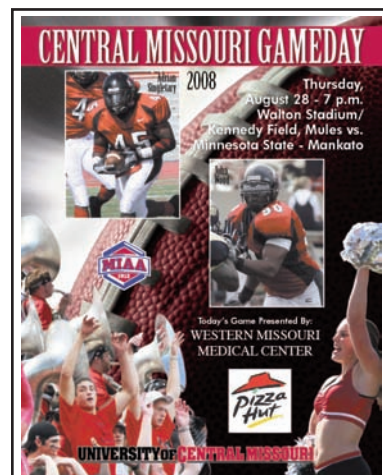
Czerniewski finished 21-of-32 for 319 yards while Givens had six grabs for 96 yards to go with his two scores. Cosby added 89 yards receiving for the Mules as well.

Mules 49, Arkansas Tech 13

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The Central Missouri Fighting Mules gave the Arkansas Tech Wonder Boys a heavy dose of senior running back **Glenn Milner** on Thursday night at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field as he tied a school record with five touchdowns and led UCM to a 49-13 win to close out the non-conference slate.

The Central Missouri offense was as balanced as could be with 249 yards rushing and 249 yards through the air. Junior signal caller **Eric Czerniewski** tossed three TD passes for the second week in a row with two of them going to Milner. The other three scores for Milner came on the ground as he racked up 137 yards on 18 carries, and he didn't even play in the fourth quarter. He tied Will Caldwell (2005 vs. Pittsburg State) and Elliott Eley (1988 vs. Northwest Missouri State) in the UCM record books.

The Mules (2-0) took their first possession 40 yards, capped by a 10-yard TD reception by Milner. The field position was set up by a 21-yard punt return by junior **Randy Shepherd**.

Arkansas Tech tried to answer on the next drive but the UCM defense stiffened in the red zone. The Mules forced a 23-yard field goal attempt that was blocked by senior nose guard **Tyler Nay** and recovered by senior bandit backer **Steven Ehase**.

Both teams were forced to punt on the next two possessions before the Mules mounted a drive into the second quarter. They went 79 yards in 10 plays, capped by a five-yard scoring run from Milner to make it 14-0.

The Wonder Boys answered that score quickly to say the least, only 32 seconds later they had a touchdown. Quarterback Cole Barthel connected with Tracey Stiger for 44 yards and then struck a play later from 24 yards out to Landon Turner to cap the two-play scoring drive.

The Mules came back down for a 67-yard drive spanning 5:43 on the next possession as Czerniewski tossed an 18-yard strike to senior wideout **Edgar Givens**, who stretched over the goal line for the touchdown (his third in two games).

Central Missouri forced a punt from the Wonder Boys and got the ball back with 3:50 remaining in the half. Czerniewski hit Givens for a 52-yard bomb on the first play from scrimmage to get the

Mules all the way down to the ATU 35 yard line. The Mules stalled at the Wonder Boy 17 and senior kicker **Mark Starks** came on to attempt a 35-yard field goal. He drilled it, but ATU made a big mistake when it was called for a roughing the kicker penalty, giving UCM an automatic first down. The Mules took advantage and Milner took a six-yard reception into the endzone to make it 28-7 at the break.

The Mules had 286 yards in the half, with Czerniewski going for 172 yards and all three of his TD's. ATU had the ball for only 11:23 in the opening period and 45 yards rushing.

Senior wide receiver **Damond Berry** seemingly put the game out of reach after the break as he took the opening kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Mule since current San Francisco 49er Delanie Walker in 2005 against Lincoln, to return a kickoff for a TD.

The Mules would score on their next two possessions, including a 62-yard drive that consisted of six runs by Milner. Both drives were capped by nine-yard scores from the senior.

Meanwhile, the Mules defense had stopped the Wonder Boys on fourth down, and senior free safety **Ryan Nesbitt** had picked off Barthel for the first turnover of the game. They also threw in a three-and-out to help the cause.

With 5:09 remaining in the third quarter, The Mules led 49-7 and backup quarterback **Tommy Corwin** was in the game.

Sophomore defensive back **Karl Parker** got in on the fun as well with his first career interception with 1:23 left in the third.

ATU tacked on a late score with 41 seconds remaining for the final margin.

UCM finished with 498 yards of offense while Czerniewski was 17-of-25 for 201 yards. Givens had three grabs for 89 yards to lead the receiving corps while junior **Tim Richmond** chipped in with five catches for 45 yards. The defense was balanced as Parker and senior defensive end **John Wood** each had six stops to lead the way. UCM held ATU to 62 yards on the ground and 289 overall through the first three quarters.

Mules 31, Truman 28

(Kirksville, Mo.) – The No. 24 Central Missouri Mules football squad jumped out early and held on late for a 31-28 MIAA road win over Truman State on Saturday night. Senior running back **Glenn Milner** rushed for 128 yards and scored twice as the Mules moved to 3-0 for the first time since 2003.

The game was the first at home for Truman this season and the first ever under new lights and synthetic turf. It was a good thing too, as it rained steadily during the entire game. Central Missouri used another balanced effort on offense and out-rushed the Bulldogs 135-3 to gain the edge in time of possession by nearly five minutes.

The Mules took their first drive down the field for a touchdown, (making it three consecutive games that they have done it) going 60 yards in 10 plays. Milner plunged in from a yard out for the score.

Truman came right back though, tying it with a 36 yard pass from quarterback Matt Ticich, who had a huge day throwing the ball. He finished with 379 yards and two TD's on the day while throwing the ball 48 times.

The Mules drove down to the Truman State 29 early in the second quarter before getting stuck with a fourth and four. Junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** was up to the task though, and he hit Milner up the seam for his second score of the day.

Central Missouri got inside the Truman 10 yard line midway through the quarter, but had to settle for a **Mark Starks** field goal to make it 17-7. The Mules had another missed opportunity on their next drive, getting the ball on the TSU 24 yard line after the Bulldogs had a bad snap over the punter's head. Three penalties by UCM forced it into a fourth and 31 and an ensuing punt.

Central Missouri looked as if it would make a rout of it in the second half after taking its first drive down the field for a score to make it 24-7. The 11-play, 67-yard drive was capped by a 12-yard strike from Czerniewski to fullback **Brent Boehringer** (first career TD).

UCM looked to pin TSU back deep after stalling at the 50 on the next possession but the Bulldogs blocked the Mule punt and Anton Bernard returned it for a touchdown. Truman continued the momentum swing in the fourth quarter by putting together a 14-play, 90-yard drive that took 7:02 off the clock. Ticich struck from seven yards out for his second TD pass of the day, cutting it to 24-21.

Central Missouri stalled again at the Truman 40 on the next drive but a pooch punt by Czerniewski pinned the Bulldogs on their own five yard line. The Mules defense made the game's next big play when junior cornerback **LaVance Dotson** picked off a Ticich pass and returned it 30 yards for a score to make it 31-21 with five minutes to play.

Truman came right back though, and used some trickery to convert a fourth and nine from the UCM 27. Phillip Henry took a lateral pass from Ticich and tossed a 26 yard pass to Phil Kenney for the conversion. Kenney then ran it in from a yard out for the score to cut the margin to three with 2:53 left.

Central Missouri knew all it had to do was get one first down to ice the game on the next possession though. Milner ran the first play two yards before junior utility man **Bobby Guillory** ran for seven more to get within one yard. Milner finished it off on third down though, getting the first down on his second effort.

The Mules had nearly 300 yards of offense in the game (162 passing and 135 rushing) while Czerniewski was 17-of-29 and perhaps more importantly, no interceptions. His main target was tight end **DeMarco Cosby** with five grabs for 62 yards. Guillory was big on special teams as he gave the Mules good field position all day, returning four kickoffs for 103 yards.

Defensively, the Mules were led by linebacker **Mike Dillon** with nine tackles while linebacker **Max Fairclough** and strong safety **Steven Ehase** had eight and seven stops, respectively.

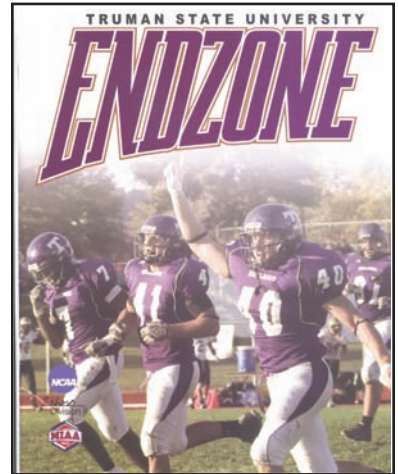

(Topeka, Kan.) – The University of Central Missouri Fighting Mules used the lethal combination of a stellar running game and a suffocating defense to hand Washburn a 28-14 loss and get head coach Willie Fritz his 78th career win, tying him with Terry Noland as the all-time winningest coach in UCM history.

When the game started it didn't look as if it would go the Mules (3-1, 2-0 MIAA) way as junior quarterback Stinson Dean threw an interception to the Ichabods' Cary Williams, who returned it 49 yards for a score at the 8:57 mark.

It was Dean's first start in nearly four years (since high school), but it didn't take long for him to get back in the groove as he led the Mules offense down the field for a 12 play, 65 yard scoring drive that spanned a season long 6:24 on the next possession. Junior running back Glenn Milner capped the march with a six-yard touchdown but perhaps the biggest play of the drive was an acrobatic, juggling catch by junior wideout Tim Richmond for 21 yards to convert on third and 12.

The Mules defense followed that by forcing WU (2-2, 1-1 MIAA) into another three-and-out, holding the Ichabods to only six plays in the first quarter. The offense tried to capitalize on the next possession, but stalled in Washburn territory and was forced to punt.

The defense came up big again though as senior free safety Kendall Ricketts laid a big hit on WU quarterback Jordan Brill on third and seven, while sophomore Adrian Chapman picked off the pass and returned it 11 yards to the WU 21. Brill got up shaky and would not return until the second half. Two plays later, Milner rolled around the corner from 21 yards out to give the Mules their first lead of the day with 11:15 to go before the break.

Central Missouri kept the onslaught going as it forced Washburn into a couple more three-and-outs before getting the ball back on its own 26 with 4:44 to go. UCM would move down the field in 13 plays and hand the ball to Justin Gore, who coasted in from five yards out to give the Mules a 21-7 lead with 14 seconds left on the clock.

The Central Missouri defense had some staggering numbers at the break. It held Washburn to 20 total yards, including -1 yard passing and not even a single first down on 16 plays. The Mules had

224 yards of offense and 14 first downs while dominating the time of possession by a margin of 20:30-to-9:30. Central Missouri ran 48 offensive plays in the half, thanks in large part to the 135 yards rushing by Milner and Jeremy Braden.

The Mules came out in the second half and allowed the Ichabods to gain a first down, but sacked Brill a few plays later and WU ended up netting only six yards before being forced to punt. That was all the Mules offense needed to put WU away though. UCM marched a season-long 78 yards down the field in their first possession of the half, capped by a third Milner score to make it 28-7 with 8:11 left in the third quarter.

The Mules looked as if they would pile it on when Justin Brown picked off another WU pass at the UCM 20 and returned it all the way to the home team's 45 before getting knocked out of bounds. The Mules returned the favor though, tossing another interception a couple plays later to give it back to WU at its 36.

The Ichabods answered this time though, driving down the field and scoring on a six-yard TD pass to Drameagon Powers. It cut the advantage to a couple touchdowns, but that was as close as it would get. Anthony Parks returned the ensuing kickoff 49 yards and gave the field position back to the Mules.

In the fourth quarter UCM gave the Ichabods one more chance, as Braden had a controversial fumble that gave WU the ball back at the Mules 30 yard line. Brill went for the score on the next play but Ricketts was there and picked off his first pass of the year, returning it 49 yards to the WU 43 with 4:57 left. The Mules ran it seven consecutive times and forced Washburn to burn its timeouts and get the clock down to 1:59 before turning it over on downs.

The Mules' Bruce Williams iced it a couple plays later though, picking off Brill for the fourth time and returning it 40 yards to the WU 21. The Mules just ran out the clock from there.

Central Missouri finished the day with 374 yards of offense (201 rushing), compared to Washburn's 142 total yards. Milner led the way for UCM with 119 on the ground while Dean completed 15-of-25 for 173 yards in the air. Adrian Singletary led the Mules 'D' with seven stops to help UCM to 2-0 in the MIAA for the first time since 2003.
